- (5) The guideline amount for the following categories will be £300: Other interest groups, Schools and Playgroups, Local support groups, National Bodies – local branch, Fundraising groups, Religious organisations, Armed Forces and Veterans groups;
- (6) Community / Residents / Youth Groups; the guideline amount for organisations in this category will be £300;
 - a. Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing activities which are made available to and benefit the wider Community;
 - b. Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing services or activities which benefit under represented groups;
- (7) The guideline amount for Performing Arts groups will be ± 500 ;
- (8) The guideline amount for Sports clubs without an additional section (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £500;
- (9) The guideline amount for Sports clubs with an additional section; (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £800;
- (10) Applications from National Bodies will normally be noted;
- (11) Senior Citizens' groups will normally be granted free use of the Town Council's community halls;
- (12) The guideline amounts will normally be awarded for normal running costs, if an organisation is planning a specific project it is encouraged to provide information, including costs, relating to that project;
- (13) Group affiliated to the same umbrella body can apply for funding if they are based at different locations and have separate bank accounts;
- (14) These guidelines apply to applications for grants and do not apply to sponsorship agreements agreed by the Town Council.



We are the Polis Community Group "Razem" based in Llanelli. We have been doing charity work for the local community around the Catholic Parish Church for many years. For years we have looked after the graves of Polish airmen in Pembrey. We also help their fellow countrymen in need.

In 2022 we organised a collection for the victims of the war in Ukraine a few days after it broke out. We rallied the town. We didn't know each other, but we managed to communicate. Our people went to Ukraine with donations and help. Last year we were able to organise formally and we officially signed our constitution in October 2023. We meet every Sunday. CETMA would like to announce that we've opened a Community Fridge in our Marsh St office in Tyisha. If anyone is unaware, a 'Community fridge' is a space with fridges and freezers that enables local people and businesses to donate fresh, good-quality surplus food that would otherwise be wasted. The donated food is then made freely available for local people to come and collect.

The fridge is open Monday to Friday from 10am till 4pm, but stock will depend on whether we've had surplus food from local supermarkets. We usually provide visitors with vegetables, fruit, tinned goods, bread, crisps etc and sometimes even pots/pans and books. We're registered with HUBBUB's Community Fridge network and are proud to be one of 400 Community Fridges across the UK!

It is proving very popular and some days we have up to 10 people calling in, but we still need to promote this much needed service and grow the visitor numbers. We're also planning an official launch in May, (when hopefully we'll have better weather) and will invite councillors.

There are two reasons for contacting you today, one to announce the opening of the fridge, the other is to ask the Council if they would like to support our service with a donation to the running costs. While the staff volunteer to collect the food from the local supermarkets and run the fridge, we still have other running costs.

Any amount would be gratefully received, and we're always available to provide more information on how the fridge works, and the other services that we offer in Llanelli (e.g. mobile phone data, one day emergency food parcels etc)

ANNUAL INVESTMENT STRATEGY

This Annual Investment Strategy is prepared in accordance with the statutory guidance on Local Government Investments issued by the Welsh Government.

All cash, bank balances, financial assets, borrowings and credit arrangements are defined as a part of the Council's treasury management activities. This Annual Investment Strategy will concentrate on the Council's temporarily surplus resources (or other financial assets it holds) and the investments it undertakes of these resources.

The Council undertakes to ensure that for all its investments, priority will be given to security and liquidity rather than to yield. In drafting this Annual Investment Strategy the Council has made appropriate arrangements for:

- Identification, management and control of risks in the investments/treasury management activities it undertakes;
- Budgeting, accounting and audit arrangements;
- Its cash and cash flow management requirements;
- Segregation of responsibilities, organisational arrangements, adequate documentation and the identification of a responsible officer for investment/ treasury management activities;
- Corporate governance;
- Procedures to ensure it is alert to the possibility it may become subject to an attempt to involve it in a transaction involving the laundering of money.

All Investments undertaken by this Council will be made and repaid in Sterling.

SUMS TO BE INVESTED

The Responsible Financial Officer will have authorisation to invest any available cash balances with H.S.B.C. Investment Bank for a period of up to 12 months.

LISTING OF INVESTMENTS UNDERTAKEN

The Council will undertake the following categories of investment for the financial year 2024-25:

- Fixed cash deposits with H.S.B.C. Investment Bank sums to be deposited as per balances;
- Deposits in Interest Earning Accounts available at the Council's Bank to a maximum of £1,000,000.

NEW INVESTMENTS – REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

If any new investment instruments (other than those approved in the list above) are proposed during the financial year 2024-25 before such an investment is undertaken it will need to first be approved by the Building and Finance Committee.

PARKS PLAYING FIELDS AND COMMUNITY CENTRES

Further to minute 78 of the Committee meeting held on the 15th January 2024, the following provides an update on developments with the Town Council Parks, Playing Fields and Community Centres.

1. <u>Peoples' Park</u>

a) <u>MUGA</u>

Replacement of further panels on the tarmac surface MUGA will be necessary over the coming months. Prices have been sought and the previous contractor Metal Masters have suggested a price of £1,550.00 plus VAT per panel. Provision of additional prices has not proved possible. Around 5 panels will require replacement and acceptance of the price is recommended.

b) <u>Play Area</u>

2 tonnes of play sand have been ordered for the play area at a cost of £548.00

2. <u>Nightingale Court Play Area</u>

Woodchip has been purchased at a cost of £192.00 for 2 tonnes.

3. <u>Clos yr Ysgol</u>

Work is scheduled to commence on the 28th May 2024 on improvements to the Play Area at Clos yr Ysgol. The works are funded in the main by the S106 Fund administered by Carmarthenshire County Council. A pre start meeting with the approved contractor Proludic was undertaken on the 16th April.

4. Penyfan Park

a) <u>Cruyff Court</u>

Further vandalism has been experienced with the floodlighting units at the Court. The possibility of placing Perspex screens in front of the unit is therefore being explored in order to prevent further damage.

b) <u>Rugby Field</u>

Provision of the U12 size rugby field has proved to be a popular addition to the Park with local youngsters making use of the facility and Llanelli area rugby club making use of the pitch for training.

5. Morfa Park

Progress with consideration of the possible asset transfer of additional land at Morfa Park has stalled as the Town Council continues to await information on the flood lights around the MUGA. Further information will be provided to the Town Council should this come to hand.

6. Land on other side of the river from Llanerch Field

Progress continues with the proposed Asset Transfer of this land, final information is awaited and it is hoped to be able to complete the matter in the relatively near future.

7. Crown Park

Provision of the Community 9 x 9 football pitch has proved to be a popular addition to the Park with local youngsters making use of the facility.

8. <u>St Barnabas Community Centre</u>

Arrangements are being put in place to close St Barnabas Community Centre from the end of May with no further hirings of the building. It is anticipated that the Centre will be handed back to the landlord from the end of June.
